Message From The Executive Director

Since 2004 Linking Generations has been developing and supporting meaningful exchanges between two generations, truly building friendship, understanding and respect between youth and older adults. Generations initially started with one program; matching teams of seniors to students; and then expanded quickly to five programs due to the program's success. We are proud that we have demonstrated measurable outcomes that intergenerational show how successfully decrease age segregation and create positive opportunities for young and old to grow together and feel valued.

Linking Generations faced some challenges in its last operating year 2012/2013 as the Original Founder of Linking Generations retired. However, 2014 brought about "New Beginnings" and a time for change for Linking Generations. Due to strong interest and demand from the seniors and youth in our community, a dedicated team of individuals resurrected the Linking Generations Programs, once again offering mentored structured visits to our seniors and youth. With a new Governance Board in place and a new Executive Director hired, together we are fully committed to re-establishing Linking Generations as a successful non-profit charity within the County of Strathcona.

The trend over the past few decades has been for less extended family living close by and thus our elderly and youth have less day to day contact. This disconnect can create a breeding ground for mistrust and misunderstanding by each age group toward the other. Linking Generations is so proud to help in bridging the generation gap by providing meaningful programs and services that involve the sharing of skills, knowledge and experiences between the young and those not so young. Since our beginnings in 2004, we have brought together more than 1620 youth and seniors throughout Sherwood Park.

In September 2014 we will link students from two Sherwood Park Junior High schools with seniors from two seniors' lodges, thus providing "linkages" to 75 youth and seniors. However, there is such a demand for our programming that we have to turn away more than 50 students. Beginning in 2015, we will begin offering our programs to two Senior High Schools, matching those students with seniors from two local care facilities. With the growing awareness of our program benefits, we are moving ahead to meet the demand and move towards a vision of a community that respects and values the gifts of all ages.

With a highly skilled staff, strong leadership, an experienced and passionate Board of Directors, tremendous volunteers, valuable community supporters, youth and seniors, Linking Generations will continue to have a positive impact throughout The County of Strathcona in this year and the coming years.

Message From The Treasurer

2014 Financial Results

In April 2014, the re-organization of Linking Generations was complete and we were pleased to receive a \$9,000 grant from Strathcona County's Family & Community Services to re-establish our programs in Sherwood Park beginning in September 2014.

Fundraising efforts have continued, resulting in an increase in unrestricted net assets at June 30th of \$10,538 over the prior year.

We are pleased to recognize all of our supporters in this report.
